#### Iran: journalist missing for a year

In a letter sent today to President Khatami, Reporters Sans Frontières (RSF) voiced its concern over the disappearance of **Pirouz Davani**, a political opponent and editor-in-chief of the independent periodical *Pirouz*. It seems that the journalist has been reported missing since the end of August 1998. RSF reiterated "its demand to see the Iranian authorities endeavour to find out what happened to the journalist" and added that "impunity of crimes is an ominous signal sent to independent leading journalists and intellectuals who should feel protected by the rule of law."

The international press freedom watchdog pointed out that "the absence of results of the investigation into this disappearance calls into question the commitment of the Iranian authorities to guarantee the safety of press freedom activists".

The concern about the fate of Pirouz Davani is reinforced by the spate of murders of five intellectuals and journalists in November and December 1998. Investigations are still under way into the assassination of Darioush and Parvaneh Forouhar two emblematic figures of the liberal opposition, Majid Sharif, editorialist for the monthly *Iran Farda*, Mohamad Mokhtari and Mohamad Jafar Pouyandeh, two influential writers in liberal opposition circles and contributors to several moderate newspapers.
